The Institute was invited by the Global Learning Public Charter School in New Bedford, MA to custom design a program to prepare students for Blue Economy careers. New Bedford received \$4.6 Billion for nation's first Offshore Wind Farm. The Institute provided educational tools and developed public-private partnerships to inspire, educate, and empower STEM career pathways.
